PROGRAM OBJECTIVE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ensure quality of products, health and safety, and environmental protection for Zanzibaris as reflected in the scope of the regulated products.</li> <li>• Minimize the risk of unsafe and sub-standard goods entering Zanzibar through the execution of conformity assessment activities in the country of export. This will help ensure that consumers are protected from unsafe and sub-standard goods, and that Zanzibari manufacturers are not subjected to unfair competition.</li> <li>• Prohibiting the entry of shoddy and counterfeit products.</li> <li>• Facilitate the clearance process by eliminating bottlenecks caused by the verification performed on arrival at entry points.</li> <li>• The guiding principle of the PVoC programme is based on Article 5 of Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT/WTO), which requires that technical requirements (i.e. Standards) applied to foreign products must also be applied to domestically manufactured products.</li> <li>• Establishing a quality import inspection regime that is in harmony with that of member states of the East African Community.</li> </ul>

<p>SCOPE OF THE PROGRAM</p>	<p>PVoC is a conformity assessment process used to verify that products to be imported into Zanzibar are in conformity with applicable Zanzibar Standards or approved equivalents, and technical regulations, before shipment.</p>
<p>VERIFICATION PROCESS</p>	<p>Exporter submits to SGS the following documents:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Request for Certification (indicating the point of entry in Zanzibar).</li> <li>• Proforma Invoice.</li> <li>• Quality Management System Certification/s.</li> <li>• Conformity Documents (test reports, quality certificates, analysis reports, etc.).</li> <li>• Final invoice (except Airfreight &amp; courier shipments).</li> </ul> <p>To obtain evidence that all requirements are met in the applicable standards or technical requirements, goods must undergo one or a combination of the following verification process:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Inspection.</li> <li>• Laboratory testing. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Laboratories accredited to ISO/IEC 17025</li> <li>- A Recognized Laboratory practicing good laboratory practices and approved by PVoC Service Provider.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Manufacturers' laboratory witnessed by PVoC Provider.</li> <li>• Factory audit.</li> <li>• Documentary verification.</li> </ul> <p>After verification process is completed and results are satisfactory, exporter will have to submit the <b>Final Invoice</b> (<i>except for airfreight and courier shipments</i>) for the issuance of the CoC.</p>
<p>ASSESSMENT METHOD</p>	<p>Three methods are proposed to the exporters to demonstrate the compliance of their products and obtain a Certificate of Conformity (CoC)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>ROUTE A:</b> Applicable to any goods and any trader.</li> <li>• <b>ROUTE B:</b> Recommended for frequent exporter with homogeneous products (Registration is renewable annually, subject to continual compliance).</li> <li>• <b>ROUTE C:</b> For Manufacturers.</li> </ul>

<p>CERTIFICATE OF CONFORMITY (CoC)</p>	<p>A <b>Certificate of Conformity (CoC)</b> is the document issued to evidence the compliance of products to the relevant approved standards.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• This document is required for Customs clearance.</li> <li>• For consignments shipped to Zanzibar without CoC, importers may be issued a penalty of 15% CIF as well as payment for Destination Inspection fees.</li> <li>• ZBS will only grant release of such goods upon completion of inspection, testing (where applicable) and verifying conformity to the Standard. It is the seller's responsibility to ensure that shipments to Zanzibar are affected only upon issuance of a Certificate of Conformity or confirmed certification decision.</li> </ul>
<p>NON-CONFORMITY REPORT (NCR)</p>	<p>If the reports from the verification activities such as testing or inspection show discrepancies versus the verification criteria, exporters will be informed accordingly and provided sufficient time to make the necessary corrections; if those are not or cannot be made a "NonConformity Report" (NCR) will be issued. This may imply that goods are not allowed to be shipped into Zanzibar.</p>
<p>FEES</p>	<p>Fees are payable in advance by the exporter. Fees are net of any tax, present or future, that may be applicable and are payable upon receipt of the Request of Certification (RFC).</p> <p>Fees are due regardless of whether after assessment of the goods the exporter or importer does not provide the information or document necessary for the final issuance of the CoC, or for any other reasons does proceed to the shipment of the goods.</p>

- Sampling of bulk shipment.
- Re-inspection.
- Witnessing of Loading and sealing of containers.

The SGS fee shall be calculated on the basis of the value of the invoice presented by the exporter or the importer.
